

The MCC Apiary is up and running with 6 hives going, 4 are 3lb. packages installed and 2 are nucleus colonies installed. As of yesterday they were all doing good with at least 5 having 2 brood boxes on and 2 will have their second brood box next week.

The bees are bringing in lots of pollen and nectar to feed the new babies and the hives are expanding. Within in 2 weeks we will be adding honey supers for them to build/repair comb and fill with nectar and turn into honey, what an exciting time!!!
